The Nation was not strong enough for Mitchell, or Mitchell was too strong for The Nation, and so he set up The United Irishman. The United Irishman carries the doctrine of resistance out in its most logical consistency, and to its utmost consequences. It spits upon repeal, it cries for independence; it calls not only for a national parliament, but for national sovereignty. It laughs at the golden link of the crown, and holds no terms with O Connell, to whom this phrase, we believe, is attributed. It scouts Victoria, and mocks Conciliation Hall with as much...
